LAROCQUE PARK HISTORY

Alfred's Larocque Park is brimming with activities for people of all ages. The park features a public swimming pool, tennis and pickleball courts, a softball field, a skate park, and a children's playground. Visitors are also able to rent various sports equipment from the library located on the property.

In 2021, the Township of Alfred and Plantagenet acquired the forest behind the park, which has since been developed to offer kilometres of trails for cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, hiking, and mountain biking.

In 2023, a monument and flagpole were erected to celebrate the town's long francophone history. Larocque Park and the adjacent woodland attract thousands of visitors from all over with its events, programming, and sporting activities.









GENDER




AGE DISTRIBUTION

ABOUT THE PROJECT AND HOW WE WILL GET THERE

The Larocque Woods are seen as a community space with great touristic potential. It is frequently used by cross-country skiers, snowshoers, mountain bikers and hikers

The Park Advisory Committee has identified five projects that could be developed over the coming years. The funding for these projects will come from two streams of revenue.

- 1. Public partnership contributions.
- 2. Commercial advertising space.

INSTALLATION OF HEBERTISM TRAILS

The Township aims to build an hebertism course, allowing visitors to discover a section of the forest through various obstacles and agility challenges. This short course pledges an exploration of parts of the woodland, presenting a vibrant fusion of leisure activities and ecological admiration.

INSTALLATION OF A WOODEN ARCHWAY AT THE ENTRANCE TO THE FOREST

The archway would help identify the entrance to the forest, and add aesthetic appeal commonly found in similar parks. They would also serve as landmarks, and could possibly be accompanied by a display showcasing useful information such as the trail map.

CONSTRUCTION OF A TOILET SHELTER

The proposed restrooms are self-cleaning, gender neutral and accessible. They would be located near the water tower at the main entrance to the woodland.




INSTALLATION OF SIGNAGE





SIGNAGE ON BASEBALL FIELD FENCES


In baseball or softball, one of the best opportunities for sponsor signage lies on the fence, along the edges of the field of play.
